- **Charge:** The Committee on Academic Librarianship shall address matters relating to the academic status and professional issues of librarians at the direction of or in consultation with the LAUC-I Chair and the Executive Board. The Committee shall also undertake other duties as directed by the LAUC-I Chair and Executive Board.

2010-2011 Implementation Tasks:

- 1. Continue to work with Library School Interest Group.
- 2. Create and distribute a survey on the Distinguished Step options to LAUC-I membership. Analyze results and share at a General Membership meeting.
- 3. Examine the feasibility of a more organized mentoring program including conducting an environmental scan of mentee and mentor needs and making a recommendation regarding a mentoring program and how it would interact with other committees and library structures such as Human Resources.
- 4. In coordination with the Web Manager, determine what committee documents and information should live on the new web site, wiki and T: drive.

Summary of Activities

- 1. Continue to work with Library School Interest Group.
 - a. ALC did not have any shared programming or meetings with the Library School Interest Group this year.
- 2. Create and distribute a survey on Distinguished Step options to LAUC-I membership. Analyze results and share at a General Membership meeting.
 - a. Based on UC Berkeley's documentation, ALC developed a survey to help elicit LAUC-I members' thoughts about the Distinguished Librarian status.
 - b. An EEE-based survey was made available from November 3, 2010-November 10, 2010.
 - c. The results of the survey were presented at the General Membership meeting on November 15, 2010.
 - d. The final report and the survey were posted to the LAUC-I website.
- 3. Examine the feasibility of a more organized mentoring program including conducting an environmental scan of mentee and mentor needs and making

a recommendation regarding a mentoring program and how it would interact with other committees and library structures such as Human Resources.

- a. An EEE-based survey was made available from May 9, 2011 through May 23, 2011.
- b. The results of the survey will be made available at the July 11, 2011, General Membership meeting.
- c. The results will be posted to the LAUC-I website.
- In coordination with the Web Manager, determine what committee documents and information should live on the new web site, wiki and T: drive.
 - a. ALC determined the following disposition of documentation and information:
 - i. T drive = agendas & minutes; raw data from surveys, etc; working documents
 - ii. Wiki = Drafts reports before acceptance by the LAUC-I membership; links to drafts' supporting documentation
 - iii. Web = Published reports & documents accepted by the LAUC-I membership, links to published documentation/reports
- 5. Other
 - ALC members provided a panel about Academic Librarianship at the Graduate Resource Center on May 2, 2011 titled "Career Options: The Academic Life As A Librarian (ALC)"
 - i. One graduate student attended and was more interested in issues regarding digitization and access to information, rather than librarianship as a career.

Recommendations for the Future

1. There are no recommendations for the future, since the LAUC-I general membership agreed to dissolve ALC and merge its functions with the Research & Professional Development Committee (RPDC) next year. The decision to dissolve ALC was driven by a shrinking membership, making it difficult to fill positions on the LAUC-I committees.
