Summary of Activities:

The Program committee sponsored the following events in 2015-2016:

- a. On November 3, 2016, the LAUC-I Program Committee hosted a talk and tour of the new UCI eSports program and arena with Mark Deppe, Acting Director. The talk took place in Langson Library, room 570 and lunch was provided. After the talk, the group walked to the arena for a guided tour. 22 librarians attended.
- b. On December 5, 2016, the LAUC-I Program Committee hosted a talk and tour of The Cove (at UCI) with Matt Bailey, Director, Communications and Ecosystem Development. The talk and tour occurred simultaneously onsite at The Cove. An optional lunch on your own took place afterwards. 12 librarians attended.

- c. On May 12, 2017, the LAUC-I Program Committee hosted a Project Management workshop from 9am-12pm. The program was open to the entire library. Twenty-one from the library (21) signed up for the event, 17 persons attended. The workshop was led by Marty Wartenberg, M.B.A., P.E., from the UCI Division of Continuing Education and was held at the Continuing Education Building, Room 2070.
- d. On August 18, 2017, the LAUC-I Program Committee hosted a speaker and panel dedicated to the theme of Libraries and Technology. Dr. Crystle Martin, PhD, gave her presentation, "Evolving Libraries into Centers of Innovation and Learning." Following her talk the UCI Libraries Digital Scholarship Services gave a panel discussion with question and answer session. The program was open to the entire library. The event took place in Langson Library, room 570 and breakfast was provided. 21 persons attended.
