Major Activities:

- Had frequent discussions about the new test-free application package review for admission, as this is the first year for UC to move onto not putting any standardized test scores in enrollment consideration.
- Reviewed and approved several changes in reader training accordingly.
- Reviewed and made recommendations for admission in some special areas, including Arts (new portfolio review method), and Business Administration (Online BA).
- Discussed and make suggestions for admitting transfer students (via TAG program) and students with special talents.

• At meetings, the chair of the Council always provided various updates and progress of BOARS (Board of Admissions and Relations with Schools.)
