The Open Content Alliance (OCA) represents the collaborative efforts of a group of cultural, technology, nonprofit, and governmental organizations from around the world that will help build a permanent archive of multilingual digitized text and multimedia content. Content in the OCA archive will be accessible soon through the OCA website and through Yahoo! The University of California libraries was one of the first content donors for the project with its 18,000-volume collection of American literature. UC libraries will continue to add material to the project as it advances.

Daniel Greenstein is the Associate Vice Provost and University Librarian of the California Digital Library, and is the Chair of the OCA's Digital Preservation Working Group.
